



I remember going to Seattle via Montana with relatives and along the way saw billboards that said "I WANT YOU FOR THE ASA" and kept it in mind when I got to Seattle and shortly thereafter walked into the recruiting office and decided that the ASA is what I wanted from the Army. I enlisted for duty in the ASA at Seattle, WA There I took the battery of tests and apparently scored high on the code test

as that was the subsequent training and duty jobs that I did while on active duty. Took basic training at Fort Ord and then onward to Fort Devens where I successfully completed and was awarded the MOS of 058 and then if was off to Turkey along with Jim Herring and Chuck Bergmann. At first I thought I was in hog heaven and was assigned to Trick#3 as a ditty-bopper. The senior NCO on Trick#3 was SFC Raymond Bernstein and I can't remember the name of the officer on Trick#3 probably because Sgt Bernstein ran the trick with an iron fist. We had a "nug" report one nite on the swing shift. This was his first duty day, so we sent him on guard duty around the fence perimeter (The MP's were in on it too!). We told him to immediately report anything that he observed. It wasn't 10 minutes later and he came running up the road and thru the gate screaming, "There's sheep in the Antenna Field! There's sheep in the Antenna Field!" He was scared out of his wit and we were laughing our asses off, and for several days afterwards! I was a 05H8 on Trick #3. The trick#3 NCOIC was SFC Raymond Bernstein. More on him later. My roommates were Howard Ramey, Jim Herring, Dennis Mallory, and a guy with the last name of Bellamy for the last couple of months in Turkey. I was assigned to Vint Hill Farms. Met my future wife at Madison College (now James Madison Univ). We were married on 1 August 1970, and have three daughters and one granddaughter. I work for the Military Traffic Management Command since 1973. I will be eligible to retire in December 2001. Pretty ordinary existence. I remember, but can't recall the names of two Manzarali GI's who took the OD's jeep which he left running in front of the NCO Club and they drove (drunk as skunks) into Ankara to the "cat house" at the Yeni Hotel. They managed to make it back to post and were promptly detained by the MP's. I think they were busted to E-2 and fined a bunch of bucks. Another jeep incident that I remember involved two or three teenage brat boys. One was the son of our Trick #3 Watch NCO, SFC Raymond Bernstein and one was the post Sergeant Major's (Bob Holder) son.. These two boys being no different than others their age went to the Motor Pool and took a jeep and got it stuck in mud and couldn't get it out and Bernstein's son went back to the Motor Pool and got a deuce and a half and got it stuck in the same mud. I believe that both boys were about 13 when this happened. We all got a hoot out of this. They were sort of folk hero's. Damned OD didn't get a thing for leaving his vehicle unattended I am really looking forward to seeing Jim Herring and Chuck Bergmann again! Thanks for all the hard work you put into this reunion. It was long overdue.

Guess the photo's wee taken after I left Det. 27 in June 1963. Got Discharged from Army right there at Manzarali Station. Yes. Walked out the front gate with a duffel bag and a suitcase and a stack of traveler's checks for an exciting tour of Greece in a VW bug with 3 California guys who'd been in school in Switzerland. Then, on to Italy in VW. (Ferry boat from Greece to Brindisi.) Then back to Beirut for the Baptist World Youth

Conference; then to Amman Jordan; walked thru Mandelbaum Gate into Israel. Spent a week or two there. Then, took Italian ship (deck chair) from Haifa to Cyprus. Then flew back to Ankara. After visiting with friends there, off to Vienna, Switzerland, Germany, France, Holland, Sweden, etc. etc. Ended up taking troop ship USS General Walker from Bremerhavn to NY City. (They cut my orders for the troop ship at Manzarali...even tho I was technically a Civilian, the US Govt. got me back to USA!!!) I was so broke, I hitch-hiked from NYC to Lawton, Oklahoma. What a great trip. What a great time I had at Manzarali Station. Never had a dull day the entire nearly 2 years!!! Good memories of friends: Bob Dade, Topper Pylant, Dave Wittrock, Bob Ancell..... Chaplain Devanney, Sgt. Fred Lee, Capt. Gerald Gibbs; trying to play

organ at chapel (as asst to Della Gibbs, organist); teaching conversational English at Turkish-American Assoc. in Ankara, 3 classes M, W, F. That's what got me switched to straight Midnight Shift . Has signed up to attend the 2007 reunion at North Myrtle Beach, SC. I called Wes on 20 April 2007 and had an interesting chat that gleaned the following info on his 4 year tour with the ASA. Enlisted in 1963 at Minneapolis, MN and took 8 weeks of basic training at Fort Leonard Wood and then to Devens for Morse Code Training and the award of MOS 058. It was at Devens that he met Tom Lazzara. Flew to Turkey on PAN AM and was stranded at Esenboga Airport for what seemed like hours. No one could help him and he couldn't speak Turkish. Finally a British school teacher gave assistance and encouraged him not to worry. He went outside where it was cold and snowing and shortly noticed a jeep pull up to the cargo area and noticed the Det 27 lettering on the bumpers. His spirits now were bubbling and walked over and asked where he was headed and the reply was Det 27. Needless to say Wes was elated and replied I'm an 058 with orders to report to Det 27 today. . Wes recalls that as they passed thru Ankara that there were Turk soldiers with weapons on all the streets and it concerned him. Some of the names that he remembers are Jerry Truman Graham who he kept in touch with until Jerry's death in August 2006 (See TAPS), Tom Lazzara, David H. Gray and Jim Rhodes was a graduate from Clemson and was a excellent baseball player in college and as a softball player at Det 27. Believes that his Trick leader was named Lutz or something like that. Enjoyed his tour as a 058 and has already made his reservation for the 2007 reunion at Myrtle Beach...



Found Wayne Rupp's entry on Bill Simons excellent Det 4 website. On 28 April 2007 called Wayne and had a lengthy chat regarding his time in the ASA from 1962 to 1964. Wayne is a native of Harrisburg, PA where he enlisted for 3 years in the ASA in 1962. Took basic at Fort Dix and then went to Devens for Morse code training. About half way thru the 058 training was diverted to Direction Finding training and upon completion in May 1963 was awarded the 056 MOS. Remembers the ride from Esenboga Airport to downtown Ankara and seeing the results of what a F-100 jet firing 20 mm cannon rounds did to a street during the May 1963 revolt. The revolt was led by the Colonel in charge of the Turk War College and its cadets. The revolt was quelled after 12 hours and the guilty were all rounded up. The in-processing at Det 4-1 took 3 days and then he flew to Sinop in the L-23 twin engine plane with SFC Matthews who was beginning his second tour at Det 4. Recalls spending first couple of weeks on the 'hill' in Quonset Hut and having to get dusted for "crotch crickets"

because someone had brought them back to the barracks from either the kara-hani's at Samsun or Ankara.

Was assigned to the Point Site as a RDF operator under the tutor of SP5 Wayne Weiss who rotated shortly there after. Flew home via PAN AM to Harrisburg for the 1963 Christmas holidays. Said that the roundtrip cost him a total of \$98. After returning to the HILL was snowed in at the point site and eating C rations for a week. .




Names that come to his mind: Bob Shadwick, Dave Rosies, Silas Wylie, Jim Johnston, Kim Stoval and Pete Cavanaugh who was a judo heavy weight MSC champion who was TDY from Sinop participating in Judo tournaments in Europe most of the time.. Remembers monitoring UPI reports on the teletype about the assassination of JFK and sending copies to the main operations and to the officers BOQ. The teletype would stop and then feed up in X's that drew a picture of JFK. It was a nerve wracking experience and many thought JFK's death was a communist plot and prelude to an invasion of the base from Russia. Was issued carbines and ammo that few knew existed on the HILL.

Remembers the time he flew on the L-23 to Samsun on a courier run and was sitting in the co-pilot seat and noticed the plane was not flying right. He glanced over and noticed that the pilot was reading a newspaper and was not concerned even after Wayne expalined his real concern.

Remembers, with a chuckle, the flap over the display of short - timer ribbons (ribbon off VO bottle) when one had 69 days or less to go.

The First Shirt (can't recall his name) temporarily put an end to this practice by confiscating all the ribbons off the bottles as they arrived on post - but - someone wrote to Seagrams and explained the situation and Seagrams sent an entire roll of the ribbon to us which ended the consfication from the bottles and dumbfounded the First Sergeant..

Anyway, and with everything considered, looking back now Wayne enjoyed his tour at Det 4. Was assigned to Fort Huachuca but did not like that assignment as the unit was over staffed with 056's and was assigned duty in the Motor Pool. Sierra Vista was just a small town with little to do and the closest 'town' was Tombstone, This caused him to inquire how he could get a new assignment. Was told that he did not have enough time left on his enlistment to get a transfer – but – if he extended his enlistment by 2 months he could be re-assigned to either Sinop, Shemya or Vietnam. Chose assignment to Vietnam and was sent to Davis Station at Tan Son Nhut Air Base in Saigon with duty at White Birch as a RDF operator where he made SP4

Was drafted at Spokane, WA in April 1960. . Took basic at Fort Ord, CA and while there was given the choice of being trained during AIT at Ord as either a truck driver or as a cook. Chose cook school and about that time was drafted into the ASA even though I was a draftee and looking back consider it a A plus in my 11 years of active duty service. Attended cook school at Fort Ord and was awarded MOS 94B and subsequently received orders for assignment to the 12th USASA Field Station in Hokkaido at Chitose, Japan and arrived there in late 1960. There I worked as a cook and enjoyed everything including the JOSON's. and was planning to return to civilian life until I was caught up in the JFK extension. With that said and possibly as an inward excuse decided to re-up for 6 years and believe it or not received no bonus. I remember the time MG Denholm toured Chitose and was appointed to set up a duck hunt for him and his entourage. I stayed at Chitose until late 1965 when orders directed me to Fort Huachuca, AZ with assignment to the 52nd ASA Test and Evaluation Center. While there I was cross trained into MOS 71L and was promoted to Staff Sergeant E6. I had 1 year and 9 months to go on my enlistment when orders for assignment to Det 4 in Sinop arrived and I was not too pleased as I was enjoying the hootchie koochie assignment. Finally I decided to go to Sinop and arrived there in April 1969 where I worked in Finance for 3 weeks under the tutelage of LT Gregory George who had been a stock broker from New York. At that time a Sgt Frank Luchs was running the NCO Club. He was an MP Sgt, but had a lot of trouble with alcoholism. There was no need for a E6 71L in Finance and I was recommended by CSM Christopherson and Master Sergeant Harry Craft (Mr. Elint) to run the Det 4 NCO Club.
