The above photo is Bill Binney at the FIRST ASA Turkey reunion at Fort Devens in 2001. Bill was a chess champion at Manzarali Station. After his discharge – Bill was hired by NSA in 1970 where he served for 30 years and had advanced to a super grade where he held numerous positions including:

- Technical director of world geopolitical and military analysis
- Operations directorate analysis skill field leader
- Member of the NSA senior technical review panel
- Chair of the technical advisory panel to the foreign relations council
- Co-founder of the Automation Research Center
- Agency representative to the National Technology Alliance executive board
- Technical director of the office of Russia
- Leading analyst for warning for more than twenty years

After retiring from NSA in 2001, Bill Binney has been a consultant on analysis and analytic techniques to various agencies of the U.S. government intelligence community including the NSA, the CIA, the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) and the Customs and Border Protection (CBP) in the Department of Homeland Security.

During the course of his work, Binney applied mathematical discipline to collection, analysis, and reporting. In the process, he was able to structure analysis and transform it into a definable discipline, making it possible to code and automatically execute the functions without human intervention from the point of collection to the end report.

This successful automation of analysis formed the foundation for prototype developments in the Automation Research Center, demonstrated how to handle massive amounts of data effectively

and relate results to military and other customers, and formed the basis for organizing an international coalition of countries to develop and share technology advances.

One of his projects was called "thin thread"

Hello Elder,

Al Lafo and I met on 26 June 2010 at the Valley of Fire State Park in Nevada for a motorcycle ride together that we had been threatening one another with for some time now. We had wanted to get together with our buddy from Det 27, Preston Bell, at his home in Barstow, CA, but he was too busy moving around the country for family events and one thing or another at this particular juncture. We hope to get together with him soon. Al arrived for the meet-up from San Diego on his Yamaha FJR 1300 and I came from Reno on my Suzuki V-strom 1000DL. In retrospect, we should have picked somewhere a little further north for our meeting place because it took me 12 hours to get there, whereas I think Al made it in about 8 hours. In any case, we beat feet out of southern Nevada early the next day because it was just too damn hot for comfort down there, even at night.

Throughout the trip Al and I spent the requisite amount of time attempting to verify and clarify one another's memories of Ankara and the guys we had graduated T/A school and were sent to Turkey with, some of whom were Preston Bell, Joe Schaefer, Rick Corriveau, Larry Oliver, Tim Kimball and John Arcizewski. We tried to remember the names of a few others we could recall from those days, but many had faded into obscurity. There was, for example, Hank Tolbert, John Day and his cohort Frank, but we couldn't recall Frank's last name. Even now, names that came up have already escaped me, although Al may recall some.

Our trip took us from NV via Mesquite, where we met Lucy, a waitress, who claimed she had acquired her accent in heaven instead of Mexico, where she was really from, and when we asked for the check accused us of wanting her address and phone number too. We cut across the northwestern corner of AZ and into Zion Park in UT, where we had to pay \$12 to drive through the park. That drive included bumper-to-bumper, stop-and-go driving over a narrow road that was under repair, full of holes and reduced to dirt and gravel, plus a cool ride through a long tunnel with no lighting. That ride cost us some gas too, but the temps moderated, the country was beautiful and after Zion Park the riding became nice and uneventful. We stopped in a town called Panquitch, UT, on Highway 89, where we overnighted at the local KOA. The place was crawling with bikers, one of whom talked bikes with us and advised us where we could find some "twisties" (curvy roads) and we had dinner (and the next day's breakfast) at the "Flying M" café there. Next day we moved north and cut across some great desert country headed toward Ely, NV. On the way we visited the Lehman caves near Baker, NV, and met the inimitable Ranger Alex, who was our guide. We moved right along to the KOA just outside Ely. We dined at the famous Hotel Nevada in Ely that night, where I must admit I had the toughest, rubberiest ribeye you can imagine and which was

anything but “medium rare”, but breakfast there the next morning was great. For our last campout, Al and I stopped at a campground just east of Austin, NV, but not before having missed the sign and overshot it by 7 miles, necessitating some backtracking. It was a moderately primitive campground with a genuine outhouse, no showers or water, but plenty of wiley ants, lurking chipmunks and high wind to test our survival skills. We lured the ants away from our bedsites with ritz crackers, kept a close eye on the chipmunks and were both able to set up our tents in the wind. We dined well at the Toiabe café in Austin. Next morning, we took our last scenic route (route 722) between Austin and Middlegate, NV, where we stopped for breakfast. We ended our ride on “the lonliest road in America” – US 50 in Fernly, NV and hightailed it into Reno to my house. Al spent a couple of nights at my place resting up then rode non-stop to San Diego topping 2200 miles for his part of the trip, while I rode a measly 1600 for mine.
