REUNION UPDATE

FOR ALL ASA VETS WHO SERVED IN TURKEY

VIRGINIA BEACH, VA

Sunday afternoon October 13, 2019 Thru Wednesday evening October 16, 2019

Currently there are twenty-two rooms booked at the Springhill Suites Hotel in VB. That calculates into thirty-eight veterans and their partners who have signed up to attend this year's reunion.

REMEMBER, reservations for attendees must be made no later than August 29, 2019. After that date the hotel will release our unreserved rooms back into their general rental system and they have the option to accept reservations at our special rate or at the going sales rate. **IMPORTANT**, we presently have only twenty-two more rooms reserved for our reunion. So don't wait until the last minute to make your reservation, because you could be paying the going room rate or not have a room.

TOURS

There are four field trip tours planned for this year's reunion. These planned tours will only materialize if we get 35 individuals to sign up for them by August 1, 2019. Reservations for each tour will be accepted on a first come first reserved basis. Your payment for these tours will not be accepted until the tours become a reality, which will be sometime in the middle of August. At that time, you will be notified by us that the tour(s) that you chose will become a reality or it was cancelled. The first three tours to become booked will be the only tours. The fourth tour will be eliminated because we only have three days available for touring the sites. If none of the planned tours receive the necessary 35 reservation by August 1st dead line, then there will be no tours for this year's reunion.

The cost of the tour includes the cost of the bus, the tour guide and the admission charge. Lunch is not included. You will be allotted time to eat lunch at the site.

There is a **separate registration form** for you to complete and send back to us if you are interested in participating in a tour(s). Just follow the instructions on that registration form. Send back your tour form right away.

October is the touring company's busiest month of the year! Our tour(s) is on a first come first scheduled basis with all the other groups that are scheduling a tour with them. Our county invites all veterans to visit the court house with a copy of their DD214. They record this information, photograph us, and issue a photo I.D. card that entitles veterans to discounts of 10-20 % at over 300 establishments in our county area. These discounts apply to restaurants, car service, building supplies, personal care, and lawyer and funeral service (even though I've not had a need of the last two yet). This list is updated twice a year and emailed to all those registered. In addition to all our county's efforts towards our veterans, our State Senator John Rafferty, with the help of county officials, yearly holds a Veterans Breakfast for over 500 veterans and spouses at the Sunnybrook Ballroom in Pottstown, Pa. On 10/27/18, Veterans Day, my wife Jane and I had the pleasure of attending this breakfast along with a neighbor from the Korean War era. Needless to say it was an outstanding event with no possible way it could be compared to any Con 4 meal (for those that remember) that us Ft. Devens guys were forced to digest. After which we had an enjoyable keynote speaker by the name of Brig. Gen. Mike Regan, Adjutant Gen-Air, PANG. Afterwards Gen. Dave wrote to the editors of the DOOL the following:

Merhaba Dean,

I found that Turkish grocery bag that I purchased when I was in downtown Sinop getting a loaf of bread (See attached) on the way to the American beach in Sinop to swim. I would stop and get a loaf of bread and a Coke for my lunch. The Turkish bread (Ekmek) is a sour dough bread and quite good.

Dave,

Back in the mid-sixties when I was stationed at Det 4 we were always short of MP's on the "Hill". We worked 12 hours permanent shifts. Sometimes we worked 14 days straight without a day off. Usually, it was 6 to 8 days with a day off then. I worked the midnight shift, 12 midnight to 12 noon. Half of the time I worked at the Main Gate and usually by myself. At 3 A.M. I would get a break and go to the mess hall for a snack and some coffee. The mess hall Turks always took real good care of the MP's (guess why). Anyway, I would fill my thermos up with fresh coffee and fill a foam coffee cup with butter and head back down to the Main Gate. When the first two buses left the base at 4 A. M. I would give the early back driver (back at 4:40 A.M.) some money for two loaves of bread, one for him and one for me. When he returned back on base, I would have twenty minutes to enjoy the very hot bread and some coffee before the second bus returned to the base. The butter from the mess hall would melt all the way into the middle of bread. The bread came unwrapped and with no bag and it was laying on the busses dirty dashboard waiting for me to pick it up.

The funny thing was that all night long, I would never see the two Turkish Guards that were supposed to be working the Main Gate, until my hot bread arrived form Sinop. Then they would show up with their mouths wide open and begging for a piece of my hot bread. Dean

2019 REUNION LOCATION

VIRGINIA BEACH, VA



The **2019 ASA / Turkey Reunion will be held this year in Virginia Beach, VA**. It will be held at the **Springhill Suites** located right on the beach and along the three-mile boardwalk. It will **start on Sunday afternoon October 13th** and it will **end on Wednesday evening October 16th**. You will be checking out on Thursday morning October the 17th. Registration will begin on Sunday around 2:00 PM and it will be located inside the hospitality room. Additional information on the location of the hospitality room will be given in a later DOOL. Our special ASA **reunion rates will be good from Saturday October 12th thru Friday October 18th**.

There are 18 King Studio Suites, 18 Queen studio Suites and 4 handicap rooms reserved for our reunion. **The cost will be \$99.00 per night**. The rooms will be on a first come first served basis. Check in is 4:00 PM and check out is 11:00 AM. There will be **sales taxes added to our room rate** based on the current applicable state and local taxes plus a \$2.00 tax. Today's tax rate is 14% plus \$2.00.

Individual attendees will make their reservations by calling the hotel directly. The phone number to call is 757-417-3982. There is also a link available for online reservations and it is "Book your group rate for Welcome ASA Turkey Reunion ". When calling in you must identify yourself as a member of the Army Security Agency / Turkey Reunion Group (Don't use ASA) in order to get our special rate. The rooms and the room rate of \$99.00 will only be good until August 29, 2019. After their cutoff date the hotel will accept reservations from attendees on a space and rate available basis.

So please, if you are planning on attending the reunion make your reservation as soon as possible. All **reservation will require a first night deposit of \$99.00 plus all taxes**. If you will need to cancel your hotel reservation, you must do so 72 hours prior to your reservation in order to get a refund on your deposit.

The hotel provides complimentary indoor parking (one car only) for each room. Unregistered hotel guests should use the 9th St. city parking garage located across the street and there is a nominal fee.

Scheduled Tours

- D. Touring the City of Norfolk Sites & Area Nauticus Complex, the Battleship Wisconsin, the Waterside District, cruise on the "Victory Rover" on a naval themed vessel, visit the MacArthur Memorial – 9:00 to 4:00 \$75.00/person

Tour sites synopsis:

Tour A

Depart via motor coach for the charming town of Williamsburg. Your tour guide will provide interesting and informative narration during the ride about the historic Virginia Peninsula and the Coastal Virginia area.



Experience a full day touring this living museum, with admission ticket providing entry into the many exhibition buildings, including the Capitol and the Governor's Palace. See the introductory film, "Story of a Patriot", tour historic homes, public buildings and 18th century craft shops where costumed hosts recreate the sights and sounds of America 200 years ago.

Guests will also enjoy free time to shop and browse in the many unique specialty shops in Merchants Square. High quality apparel, gifts, jewelry, beautiful furniture and holiday decorations are but a few of the offerings found in this quaint, picturesque shopping area. Guests may enjoy lunch on their own in one of the Colonial Taverns or in Merchants Square. The guide will point out all the dining options as you pass through town.

TOUR B

Board the motor coach with your tour guide and spend the morning at Jamestown Settlement. Established in 1607, this was the first permanent settlement in

the New World. Guests will enjoy touring the re-created village of Jamestown which chronicles the nation's 17th century beginnings in Virginia in the context of its Powhatan Indian, English and western central African cultures. Jamestown represents an enduring legacy of language, culture and government. Through an introductory film, "1607: A Nation Takes Root," and expansive 30,000 square foot indoor exhibition galleries, guests will discover the political, social and economic factors that led to the



colonization of the New World, the culture of the Powhatan Indians of coastal Virginia at the time of the English arrival, and the first century of the Virginia colony when Jamestown served as its capital. Outside, history comes alive in re-creations of a Powhatan Indian village, a colonial fort, and the three ships - Susan Constant, Godspeed and Discovery - that transported English colonists to Virginia in 1607. Costumed historical interpreters demonstrate work and everyday life of the era and engage visitors in a variety of activities. Lunch can be enjoyed on your own in the Jamestown Café and there will be time to browse the beautiful gift shop for unique "Made in Virginia" items.

Next, travel to nearby Historic Jamestown Island, original site of the first permanent English settlement in America in 1607. Exhibits include ruins of the 17th century settlement, a beautiful visitor's center as well as the 1639 Church Tower, the only 17th century building still standing at Jamestown, and one of the oldest English built structures in the United States. In the outdoor living-history areas, guests can witness artillery demonstrations, drill with wooden muskets at a re-created Continental Army encampment and explore a Revolution-era farm based on a real-life 18th-century family.

Enjoy lunch on your own in the quaint village of Yorktown.

Then visit the Yorktown Battlefield to see first-hand where the battles took place. Begin at the visitor's center and then view the Revolutionary War battlefields and associated sites. Your guide will point out areas of interest.

TOUR D

• Travel with your tour guide to **Nauticus**, a unique and thriving campus of visitor attractions that explores the economic, naval, and natural powers of the sea. Features here include a series of interactive exhibits, 3D, high-def films in the 250-person theater, and

aquariums of marine life. Also housed here is the Hampton Roads Naval Museum, one of ten museums officially operated by the U.S. Navy. Highlights of the naval battles and exhibits of detailed ship models, artwork, and memorabilia are showcased throughout.

Explore the main deck and recently opened portions of the interior to learn about this famous ship, those who fought and served on board and the role that this mighty warship has played in the defense of our nation.
